




In order to commemorate the 50th Anniversary of the NWT Association of Communities a colouring book featuring the history and stories of all 33 communities was created.
















HEALTHY COMMUNITIES



The Step it Up! Infographic is a graphical representation of the Guide.











The NWT Healthy

CLIMATE CHANGE & COMMUNITIES

With numerous resolutions and concerns expressed about the impacts of climate change on NWT Communities, the NWTAC has been making this one of their areas of focus.

We have been working with numerous partners on this file but would highlight the larger initiative completed recently. Working with Geotechnical and Environmental Economists, with funding from CANNOR, NWTAC completed a study to look at "The Technical Opportunities and Economic Implications of Permafrost Decay on Public Infrastructure in the Northwest Territories.

This work showed the economic impacts of permafrost decay on public infrastructure will be in the order of \$ 1.3 billion.


This document will play an important role as we work with the Territorial and Federal Governments as we attempt to secure this funding.












The NWTAC has been actively participating in the development of standards through the Northern Infrastructure Standards Initiative. Those completed to date include:

- Thermosyphons
- Existing Buildings
- Storm water Management
- Snowloads
- Geotechnical Site Evaluation in Permafrost Zones

Using the Climate Change Guide for Communities already developed by the NWTAC and Ecology North, a Climate Change Course was developed for the School of Community Government.

The course was further distilled to be a chapter that can be added to other courses and programs at the School. This was made possible through funding from the School and ENR.
