

Arctic Energy Alliance funding for community governments is increasing!

The Arctic Energy Alliance (AEA) has additional funding available for energy projects for the next three years. Start planning now so that you can complete projects and receive the maximum funding in each of these three fiscal years.

Building energy audits: If you have not had energy audits completed on your buildings apply ASAP—spots for 2019/20 are filling up fast. Energy audits will provide you with a list of recommendations with estimated savings and costs to you can budget for the building retrofits and use the reports to secure funding to help pay for the upgrades.

Rebates: Rebates are available for eligible projects such as LED lighting, programmable thermostats, PV panels, wood pellet boilers, etc. in community-government-owned buildings. Generally, the AEA is able to provide 50% of the funding for many of the recommendations from the building energy audit reports.

Funding to help communities adapt to climate change impacts

Climate Change Preparedness in the North (CCPN)

(Link to Funding Information attached) and the Climate Change Health Adaptation Program (CCHAP) (Link to Program Information attached) focus on building capacity and resilience in communities by funding community-led climate change adaptation projects. Proposals for both programs are accepted on an ongoing basis and will be reviewed by the NWT Climate Change Committee for Adaptation approximately four times per year.

The next application deadline is April 10th.
