
### **Built Environment Toolkit**

### Bill 29: ATIPP Plan Update

An Act to Amend the Access to Information and Privacy Protection Act started its process in the Legislative Assembly on June 6, 2019.

This Bill includes bringing community governments under the ATIPP Act over time and in a staged manner. The NWTAC will be be following this process and will update communities on any new information that will help with better understanding of the Plan and the process.

# **Funding Opportunities**

### **GHG Grant Program for Buildings and Industry**

The Government of the Northwest Territories' (GNWT) GHG Grant Program for Buildings and Industry is an application based non-repayable grant program designed to support greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions reduction projects and initiatives for NWT businesses, industry and non-profit organizations.

- Up to \$100,000
- Up to 25% coverage of eligible expenditures for businesses and building owners
- Up to 40% coverage of eligible expenditures for non-profit organizations

For the May 10, 2019 application period, applications must be submitted by **July 2, 2019**.
