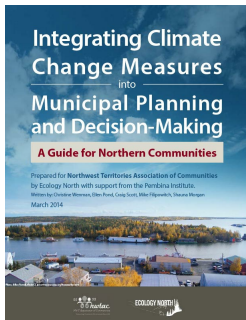

The Government of the Northwest Territories' Department of Environment and Natural Resources' is issuing a call for project Letters of Intent (LOI) for the NWT Cumulative Impact Monitoring Program



(NWT CIMP) for the 2020/21 funding year. This is to better assess project eligibility.

NWT CIMP is pleased to provide you with the 2020-2021 Scientific Proposal Guide and 2020-2021 Traditional Knowledge Proposal Guide in French and English. These documents outline the program goals and detail the project funding process.
