
# Northwest Territories Association of Communities COVID-19 Thank you and Border Measures Video



## GNWT announces new supports for postsecondary students

The Minister of Education, Culture and Employment (ECE), R.J. Simpson, announced two new grants available for all post-secondary students accessing full-time Student Financial



Northwest Territories

COVID-19 Economic Relief Measures.

Assistance (SFA) benefits in the 2020-21 academic year as part of the GNWT

The SFA program supports students with post-secondary education-related expenses.

To address the realities that students face with the transition to online learning and COVID-19 impacts, the two new taxable grants will help students with the costs of technology equipment and internet services.

- The Technology Grant is a one-time grant which provides \$750 towards offsetting the cost of technology equipment, such as computers, printers, scanners, tablets etc.
- The Support Grant is an additional \$100 per month for the duration of the student's 2020-21 academic year, to assist with additional costs, such as internet fees.

Over 10,100 households in northern communities to have access to improved broadband Internet service

CRTC Broadband Fund to contribute \$72 million to selected projects in northern Manitoba, Yukon and the Northwest Territories

August 12, 2020 – Ottawa-Gatineau – Canadian Radio-television and

Telecommunications Commission (CRTC).

Today, the CRTC announced the first five projects that will receive funding from the Broadband Fund to improve Internet access services to more than 10,100 households in 51 communities, the significant majority of which are Indigenous.

## **CLIMATE CHANGE PREPAREDNESS**

Funding available to help communities adapt to climate change impacts

Climate Change Preparedness in the North (CCPN) and the Climate Change and Health Adaptation Program (CCHAP) are accepting proposals for NWT projects that can get started this fiscal year (2020-2021). Proposals can be for one-year or multi-year projects. **Proposals must be submitted by Thursday, September 17 in order to be considered for this funding cycle.** 

If this deadline is too soon for you, don't worry! A second proposal process for CCPN and CCHAP funding will be announced towards the end of August. This second process will be for NWT projects starting on or after April 1, 2021 and will involve a two-step

application process. Again, proposals can be for one-year or multi-year projects. More details will be shared soon.
