Today, the NWT takes its first careful steps towards a more open society.

The territory needed to complete several essential steps to move into Relaxing Phase One of eased measures outlined in the Emerging Wisely Plan shared with residents earlier this week.

Today, the territory completed the final essential step by having no community spread for 28 days since the last negative test was collected for the final recovered case.

With no community spread, the territory is now implementing an order to ease up on the public health restrictions across the NWT. The order is effective immediately.

The Arctic Inspiration Prize inspires team building (even while practicing physical distancing!) and encourages the development of projects that deliver near-term benefit to Arctic communities. Prize Categories

\$1 Million - One \$1 million prize may be awarded to one exceptional team. AIP - Up to four teams will be awarded up to \$500,000 each.
