ASSET MANAGEMENT



PROFESSIONAL CERTIFICATE IN ASSET MANAGEMENT PLANNING

This initiative is delivered through the Municipal Asset Management

Program, which is delivered by the Federation of Canadian Municipalities and funded by the Government of Canada.

Eligible participants include Canadian municipal staff and elected officials, individuals employed by a not-for-profit corporation that has an infrastructurerelated shared services agreement with a municipality (e.g. utilities, transit authorities, conservation authorities, etc.) and individuals employed by an Indigenous community that has a shared services agreement with a neighboring municipality or elected officials from that Indigenous community. Other countries, or full fee-paying participants, please

visit www.ipwea.org/certificate.

The normal course fee is C (2,650 + 5% GST per person; however, the FCM subsidized fee payable is Total C) Total C

IMPORTANT: Conditions apply, including:

- 1. Participants must meet eligibility as per the statement above.
- Maximum four eligible participants per local government or other eligible entity as listed above per course unless otherwise agreed to by FCM. Any other interested participants from the same local government can enrol in the <u>following course</u>.
- 3. Discount
- 4. Submission of a letter of commitment & support to undertake the course from the municipality (template will be provided later).
- 5. Participants from the same local government or other eligible entity as listed above enrolled in a course must complete the initial and final Asset Management Readiness Scale (AMRS) as a team.

Green and Inclusive Community Buildings

Infrastructure Canada will be providing up to \$1.5 billion in federal funding for community buildings that will support retrofits, repairs or upgrades of existing

public buildings and the construction of new public buildings that serve communities across Canada. This proposed program is still in development and is not accepting funding applications at this time.

This funding commitment is part of Canada's strategy to meet ambitious climate objectives and was announced on December 11, 2020, as part of the Government of Canada's Strengthened Climate Plan. This initiative will also support economic growth and job creation, and building more inclusive communities where all Canadians have opportunities to thrive.

At least 10 percent of this funding will be allocated to projects serving First Nations, Inuit and Métis communities, including Indigenous populations in urban centres.

Provincial, territorial and local governments, not-for-profit and Indigenous organizations are invited to provide ideas on potential priorities to Infrastructure Canada through the online program development <u>questionnaire</u>.

NORTHERN FOOD INNOVATION CHALLENGE

The Northern Food Innovation Challenge is one of three streams under the Northern Isolated Community Initiatives (NICI) Fund.

The objective of this Challenge is to support innovative, community-led projects for local and Indigenous food production systems to help improve food security in Canada's territories.

Priority will be given to projects that use innovative solutions that work in a northern or remote climate, can be deployed in the territories, and address one or more of the following areas:

- Food Production/Harvesting
- Food Processing
- Food Distribution/Transportation

Projects related to innovative training and capacity building in these areas will also be considered.

Priority will be given to proposed projects that address food security in Indigenous communities or other vulnerable populations.

Why Should You Apply?

- Funding for project costs up to \$250,000 for successful applicants in Phase 1.
- Final Innovators will be eligible for up to \$1 million to deploy their project in Phase 2.
- Access to northern experts and CanNor support to shepherd project development through pathfinding and mentorship.
- Be part of the solution to tackling one of the biggest challenges in Canada's territories!
