CHILDHOOD INFRASTRUCTURE FUNDING

EARLY CHILDHOOD INFRASTRUCTURE FUND (ECIF)

The Government of the Northwest Territories (GNWT) is now accepting proposals for the Early Childhood Infrastructure Fund (ECIF). For the 2022-2023 fiscal year, \$1M is available through Early Childhood Infrastructure Fund to provide non-profit organizations and Indigenous governments with funding for infrastructure repairs and retrofits to support the preservation, expansion and creation of centre-based child care spaces in communities across the Northwest Territories.



Proposal deadline: December 10, 2021 at 5 p.m. MST.
