Award Description

Goal

- Recognize and celebrate an NWT community that demonstrates outstanding leadership in climate change adaptation.
- Honour a community taking a proactive approach to addressing climate change challenges and strengthening resilience through tangible actions.

Eligibility

Open to all 33 community governments in the Northwest Territories.

Criteria

Communities should demonstrate how they are actively addressing climate change impacts and enhancing resilience. Examples of eligible actions include:

- Integrating climate change considerations into budgets, policies, bylaws, operations, and planning.
- Providing programs or opportunities for residents to learn about and take action on climate resilience (e.g., community gardens, fire-smart initiatives, harvesting programs, and cultural activities).
- Conducting planning and assessment projects to identify climate risks and vulnerabilities, and developing strategies or tools to enhance resilience.
- Implementing measures to make infrastructure more resilient to climate change impacts.
- Collaborating with other organizations, communities, and levels of government to support climate adaptation efforts.
- Participating in relevant training, pilot projects, workshops, or other learning opportunities.

Award

• \$5,000 to support a resilience-building initiative within the winning community.
