ADVOCACY: THE FOUNDATION OF OUR WORK

The NWT Association of Communities (NWTAC) is the collective voice of community governments in the Northwest Territories. Advocacy is at the core of everything we do.

We work year-round to champion the needs of communities by meeting with elected officials and government representatives at all levels. Our advocacy is guided by resolutions passed at each Annual General Meeting, ensuring that NWT communities have a strong voice in shaping policy, legislation, and funding decisions.

Through persistent advocacy, NWTAC has helped secure:

- Increased funding for community services and infrastructure
- Stronger local governance and decision-making support
- Policy improvements in areas like housing, healthcare, and climate action

We work directly with the GNWT, the federal government, and key decision-makers to ensure that community needs are heard—and acted upon. We sit on and advise on various Territorial and Federal Committees.

COMMUNAL CLIMATE CHANGE PROGRAMS

NORTHERN COMMUNITIES INSURANCE PROGRAM (NCIP)

NCIP is a community-owned reciprocal insurance program designed specifically for NWT municipalities. Since 2003, it has saved communities over \$25 million, while keeping insurance rates frozen at 2001 levels.

PROACTIVE RISK MANAGEMENT & PREVENTION

- Loss Prevention Incentive Program – Over \$5.5 million provided since 2010.
- Building Inspection Program – Financial incentives for regular inspections.
- Heater Inspection Program – \$15,000 annually for heating system inspections.
- Bylaw Improvement Program – One-time \$5,000 grant for updating procurement and water/sewer bylaws.
- Appraisal Program – Annual property assessments for long-term maintenance and budgeting. Forms core of asset management planning.
